The Hampshire Advertiser 4 Apr 1863 A Forest on Fire

On the afternoon of Tuesday the people in the neighbourhood of West Lavington and Todham were very much alarmed by seeing a portion of Todham Rough, to the extent of about 20 acres of underwood, in a blaze. It appears there was a good deal of horse grass in the wood, but how it took fire we believe is at present unknown. The hares and the rabbits could be seen running away very much singed, and the fir trees caught fire at the bottom branches, and the flames immediately ran to the top of the trees, some forty feet high. Those who saw it said it was one of the grandest sights they ever witnessed. The men working on Todham farm came with large boughs and beat about as well as they could, and about six o'clock they began to get it under. The portion that was burnt belongs to Mr Mullens Dennett, of Lodsworth.
