(ii) 23 November 1858. Will of the said Peter Marchant Lashmar, by which he bequeathed all his real and personal estate unto Thomas Marchant Lashmar (since deceased), the said William Penfold, and John Marchant Lashmar (since deceased), upon trust, and in respect of the said property, to the use of his niece, Elizabeth Brown of Huddleston in Steyning, widow, and after her death, to the use of her children, the said Edwin Brown, Thomas Brown, William Osmond Brown, Louisa Leeney, and Charles Brown, and George Brown and Richard Brown (both since deceased)

(iii) 14 December 1859. Probate of the said Will proved at Chichester District Registry

(iv) 11 October 1861. Grant of Letters of Administration of the said George Brown, son of the said Elizabeth Brown, to Sarah Brown, his widow, at the Principal Probate Registry

(v) 7 March 1885. Grant of Letters of Administration of the said George Brown to the said Richard Brown at the Principal Probate Registry, on the death of the said Sarah Brown

(vi) That the said Elizabeth Brown died on 6 December 1884, and that the said William Penfold, as surviving trustee of the said Thomas Marchant Lashmar, had, with the consent of the said Edwin Brown, Thomas Brown, William Osmond Brown, Louisa Leeney, Charles Brown, and Richard Brown, agreed to assign the said property to the said Edward Stanford and Alfred Stanford for the residue of the said term of 2000 years
