Wairarapa Daily Times 08 Oct 1919 Wedding

A wedding of much interest was solemnised at Knox Church, Masterton, today, when Miss Ulva Stewart, third daughter of Mrs Alex Stewart, Essex street, was married to Mr W. W. Chambers, of the Bank of New Zealand, Wellington. The bride, who was given away by her brother, Mr Gordon Stewart, of Hastings, and attended by her sister, Miss Alexa Stewart, and Miss Edith Chambers, sister of the bridegroom, wore a white dress of Georgette and crepe-de-chine with fishtail lined with pale pink, and trimmed with tiny rosebuds. The bridesmaids were dressed in saxe blue cabre crepe and Georgette, with black velvet brassiers. They also wore blue tulle veils with coronet of silver leaves, and carried sheafs of pale pink flowers. Mr A. F. Eilers acted as best man, and Mr Kenneth Stewart as groomsman. After the ceremony Mrs Stewart entertained the guests at the wedding breakfast. The happy couple then left for the South by car, the bride wearing a biscuit gabardine costume faced with lighter shade, with hat to match. Amongst the numerous presents received was a handsome silver tea service from the staff of the Bank of New Zealand, Wellington.
