

## John Eric CROWTHER (1831-1901)

*Wellington Independent 04 Sep 1866*

[Copy.] Upper Wainui-o-mata District, 1<sup>st</sup> September 1866. To John Grace, Esq., Justice of the Peace. Sir, We the Undersigned Landholders of the Upper Wainui-o-mata District, request that you will convene a Meeting of Ratepayers in said district, for the purpose of forming a New Board of Wardens and levying a Rate for the making and maintenance of roads in the district. We are, Sir, Your obedient servants, William Alfred Fitzherbert, Hugh Sinclair, George Wood, Frederick Kershaw Crowther, John Crowther. In compliance with the above Requisition, I appoint a Meeting of Landholders in Upper Wainui-o-mata District, to be held on Saturday, 29<sup>th</sup> day of September, at the School-House, Upper Wainui-o-mata, at 2 o'clock p.m. John Grace, JP. Wainui-o-mata Valley, 1<sup>st</sup> September 1866.

A meeting of the ratepayers of the Upper Wainui-o-mata district was held on Saturday, 29<sup>th</sup> ult., when the following persons were elected members of the Board of Wardens for the next two years:- Messrs George Allen, John Crowther, George Wood, John Sinclair, J. C. Dick, and W. A. Fitzherbert, chairman.

*Wellington Independent 21 Nov 1867 From the Provincial Gazette – Crown Grants*

Crown Lands Office, Wellington 18<sup>th</sup> November 1867. The Undermentioned Deeds of Grant having been duly executed, are now ready for delivery at this office, under the authority of the "Crown Grants Act, 1860." A fee of sixpence is chargeable on each Crown Grant for every month during which it shall remain in this office after the expiration of three months from the date of this notice. In cases where it is impossible for the party entitled to receive the Grant to attend in person, it will be delivered to the bearer of an authority, according to the subjoined form certified by a Magistrate or by a Solicitor of the Supreme Court.

The usual monthly meeting of the above Board was held at the office, Hutt, on Wednesday...the following resolution was carried... That the Warden, No. 4 Ward, be authorized to employ a competent engineer to lay off the road from the main line of the Wainuiomata road to John Crowther's property...

*Evening Post 30 Sep 1884 Advertisement*

To Let, by Tender, a Farm in the Wainui-o-mata, known as the "Woodlands," containing 400 acres, more than 100 are fenced in and subdivided, including seven-roomed house, stable, cowshed, barn and orchard. *Evening Post 17 Jun 1890 In the Supreme Court of New Zealand- Wellington District*

Pursuant to an order of the Supreme Court of New Zealand, in the matter of the Estate of James Jackson, deceased, and in an action between Nancy Crowther, Plaintiff, and Tom Wood and others, Defendants. Let all persons claiming to be entitled to or interested in all that piece of land situate in Dixon-street and being the eastern half of the section number 182 on the plan of the City of Wellington, devised by the will of the testator, James Jackson, late of Lowry Bay, in Port Nicholson, farmer, to the child or children of his sister, Eliza Wood, by themselves or their solicitors, come in and prove their claims at the office of the Registrar of this honourable Court at Wellington, on or before the 23<sup>rd</sup> day of July 1890, or in default thereof they will be peremptorily excluded from the benefit of the said order. Thursday, the 24<sup>th</sup> day of July, at the hour of 11 o'clock in the forenoon, at the said office, is appointed for hearing and adjudicating upon the claims. Dated this 10<sup>th</sup> day of June, 1890. Signed D. G. A. Cooper, Registrar.

*Evening Post 29 Sep 1893*

The action of Crowther v. Dicks and others, which has been pending in the Supreme Court for over three years, was finally determined this morning in Chambers, by Mr Justice Richmond. The case was brought to decide as to the persons who are entitled to a certain freehold property in Dixon-street of considerable value, formerly belonging to one of the early settlers named Jackson, who died many years ago. A decree was no made in the action, declaring Mrs Nancy Crowther, D. Dick, jun., Mrs D. Dick, jun., Mrs J. Wood, John Crowther, and Miss C. Sinclair to be entitled thereto, by descent or otherwise, and for a sale of the property and division of the proceeds, in lieu of a portion thereof, amongst them. Messrs A. de B. Brandon, Devine, Travers and Brown were the several counsel engaged.
