Daily Southern Cross 5 Oct 1863 Arrival of the ship 'Tyburnia' – Captain Coate
A large ship was signalled yesterday morning, and shortly afterwards the signalman ran up the penant for her having come to an anchor. Later in the afternoon, Mr Burgess, the pilot, brought up the alarming intelligence that it was the ship Tyburnia, from England, with emigrants, and that the small-pox was on board. On her being signalled this morning, the pilot put off, and on clearing the reef off Rangitoto, he saw that she had come to an anchor in the bight between Rangitoto and Motu Tapu. On getting under her stern, he was hailed from the ship and informed that the small-pox was on board. Mr Burgess desired that a report might be given to him to bring to town for instructions. This being made out and enclosed in a bottle was thrown overboard and brought up to town by the pilot, who kindly furnished us with the following particulars. She left Gravesend on the 2nd June, and has had very boisterous weather during the passage, making a very good run to Tasmania, but has been twenty days coming from there. The small pox broke out on board ten days after leaving England, and the Doctor reports the total number of cases as 35, 9 serious, and 26 of a mild character, one death, a male adult over 50 years of age, from small pox. The last case broke out on the 22nd of last month, since when there have been no fresh ones. There is a large mail bag on board which the Captain wanted the pilot to bring up to Auckland; he of course refused to do so. The instructions received by Mr Burgess are to bring the vessel as far as Rangitoto passage which will be done this morning, the pilot cutter showing her the road up. There is a nice level spot of land on Rangitoto, just by the reef, which will in all probability be used as the quarantine ground.... Passengers... Third class ...John, Jane, John C.
