This building was erected by public subscription, with the assistance of a grant from the Educational Committee of Her Majesty's most Honourable Privy Council, for the purpose of a school, in union with "The National Society for promoting the education of the poor in the principles of the Established Church throughout England, and for the education of children of the labouring, manufacturing, and other poorer classes in the district of St Stephen's, in the parish of the Holy Trinity, in the borough of Kingston-upon-Hull. The foundation stone was laid by Sir Henry Cooper, Knight, M.D., the worshipful the Mayor of Kingston-upon-Hull, in the second year of his mayoralty, on Wednesday the 11<sup>th</sup> day of April, in the eighteenth year of the reign of her most gracious Majesty, Queen Victoria, and in the year of our Lord, 1855.
