

Inventory of the Personal Estate of Dr John MACLAGAN 1834
Forfar Sheriff Court Reference SC47/40/10

At Forfar the nineteenth day of March Eighteen hundred & thirty four years in presence of Andrew Robertson Esquire Commissary Depute of the Commissariat of Forfarshire compeared Mr Thomas Carnaby Writer in Forfar & gave in the Inventory and Oath and Extract Deed of Settlement afterwritten to be registered in the Commissary Court Books of said shire in court of Law whereof the tenor follows:

Inventory of the personal Estate of Doctor John MacLagan of Glenquiech who died on the twenty first day of March eighteen hundred and thirty one years.

1. Cash in the hands of the deceasts Factor and Collector of Rents and due to him at the time of his death £3,107 3s 10d.
2. Amount of value of Farm Stocking Implements of Husbandry and Household furniture belonging the deceased as valued by a Licensed Valuator and Appraiser on the 29th of March 1831 £242 19s 6d.
3. Balance of Rents due to the deceast for crop 1830 payable at Whitsunday and Lammas 1831 £276 18s.
4. Balance of Bill by Messrs Wallace in Lawrence Kirk to the defunct dated 4th November 1828 and payable three months after date £9. Interest thereon from 7 February 1829 to 21st March 1831 the day of his death, 2 years and 14 days 18s 4d.
5. Balance of Bill drawn by the deceast upon and accepted by Mrs Robert Dow in Blairgowrie and the Revd David Harris of Fearn for £30 dated 10th June 1828 and payable three days after date £13 4s. Interest thereon from 13th June 1828 to the 21st March 1831, 2 years and 281 days £1 1s 16d

Moness 15 March 1834. This is the Inventory referred to in the oath remitted by me of this date (signed) Catherine Sinclair MacLagan, W. J. L. Campbell JP

At Moness the fifteenth day of March eighteen hundred and thirty four years; In presence of Mr W. J. L. Campbell of Glenfalloch one of His Majesty's Justices of the Peace for the County of Perth Commissioner appointed by the Commissary Depute of the Commissariat of Forfarshire to take the following oath; compeared Mrs Catherine Anderson or Sinclair MacLagan spouse of Mr Daniel Sinclair MacLagan residing at Coaltullich near Aberfeldy, Executrix appointed by the deceased Doctor John MacLagan of Glenquiech who being solemnly sworn and examined, Depones that the said Doctor John MacLagan died upon the twenty first day of March Eighteen hundred and thirty one, and the Deponent has entered upon the possession and management of the deceasts personal Estate as Executrix, nominated and appointed by him in a Disposition and Deed of Settlement executed by him on the fourth day of July Eighteen hundred and twenty eight, and registered in the Sheriff Court Books of Forfarshire the Twenty eighth day of March, eighteen hundred and thirty one an Extract of which is now exhibited by the Deponent & signed by her and the said Commissioner as relative here to; That the Deponent does not know of any Settlement or writing relative to the disposal of the deceasts personal Estate or effects or any part of them other than that now exhibited; That the prefind Inventory which is signed by the Deponent and the said Commissioners as relative hereto, is a full and complete Inventory of the Personal Estate and Effects of the said deceased Doctor John MacLagan situated and

belonging or due to him at the time of his death so far as the same is come to the Deponents knowledge; And that the value of said Estate situated in Scotland is above the value of said Estate situated in Scotland is above the value of Three thousand pounds sterling and under the value of Four thousand pounds sterling. All which is truth as the Deponent shall answer to God [signed] Catherine Sinclair MacLagan, W. J. L. Campbell JP

At Forfar the twenty eighth day of March eighteen hundred and thirty one years in presence of James Lamy of Dunkenny Esquire Advocate Sheriff of Forfarshire Compeared Mr Samuel Wyllie Writer in Forfar as procurator for the after designed subscriber of the Deed of Settlement underwritten and gave in the same desiring that it might be inserted and registered in the Sheriff Court Books of said shire conform to the clause of Registration therein contained which desire the said Sheriff finding to be just and reasonable he ordained the same to be done accordingly whereof the tenor follows viz:

I John MacLagan Esq., of Glenquich & Wester Memus in the event of my dying without lawful Heirs of my body Do by there presents Give Grant Assign & Dispone to and in favor of my nephew Daniel alias Donald Anderson son of my sister Margaret MacLagan wife of Alexander Anderson in Coaltullich and to the Heirs of the said Daniel alias Donald Anderson whom failing to my niece Katharine Anderson their daughter and her Heirs; whom failing to Margaret MacLagan daughter of Helen MacLagan my deceased Sister and her Heirs; whom failing to John MacLagan her son and his heirs whom failing to David MacLagan his brother and his heirs, whom failing to Alexander MacLagan and his heirs the borther of the saids John Maclagan and David MacLagan sons of the said Margaret MacLagan whom all failing to my own nearest heirs and assignees whomsoever heritably and irredeemably (but under the burdens and provisions aftermentioned) All and Whole my Estates and Lands of Glenquich and Wester Memus debts heritable and moveable, crop, stocking, furniture, books, plate, Bank notes, money and in general my whole means and estate heritable & moveable of whatever nature or denomination or wherever situated presently belonging or which shall belong to me at the time of my death. Together with the whole Titles, Writs and Evidents of my Heritage vouchers and instructions of my moveables, and with all right title interest and claim I have or can pretend or any other claiming as in my right could have or pretend to the said Heritable and moveable Estate. Moreover I do hereby bind and oblige me my heirs and successors to Infett Vest and Seize the said Daniel alias Donald Anderson and also the said Katharine Anderson and their heirs respectively and also my other Disponees foresaid and their respective heirs in the Estate and Lands of Glenquich and Wester Memus foresaid and the whole other Lands and Heritages belonging to me above disponed requiring infettment to be holden either a me vet de me or in manner mentioned in my Rights and Titles to the several respective Properties And for that purpose to make grant subscribe and deliver to the said Daniel alias Donald Anderson and his heirs whom failing to the said Kathrine Anderson and her heirs whom failing to my other Disponees on the order before mentioned and their heirs, all necessary Deeds Conveyances and Writings with Procuratories of Resignation and Precepts of Sasine and all clauses necessary for fully vesting the premises in their persons respectively as aforesaid failing the first disponee and so on. An I nominate & appoint the said Daniel or Donald Anderson and his foresaids whom failing the said Kathrine Anderson and her foresaids whom failing the other persons in their order respectively to be my Executor or Executors and universal Legators and Intromitters with my moveable Estate But these presents are granted with this Declaration and Provision that the said Daniel alias Donald Anderson and his heirs shall be bound and obliged as by acceptance hereof they bind and oblige themselves To pay out of the first and readiest of the Estate & effects hereby conveyed all my just and lawful Debts with my funeral charges and any Gifts or Legacies I may think proper to leave by any letter or writing under my hand and particularly the following Legacies viz:

The sum of three hundred pounds sterling to the said Kathrine Anderson and the sum of two hundred pounds sterling to the said Margaret MacLagan Yor and the sum of twenty pounds to the poor of the parish of Tannadice and failing the said Daniel alias Donald Anderson and his heirs and the said Kathrine Anderson or heirs succeeding to me than she or her heirs shall be and are hereby taken bound in like manner to pay my debts and funeral expences and any Legacies I may leave by a writing signed by me and particularly to pay the Legacy of two hundred pounds to Margaret MacLagan Yor and of twenty pounds to the poor of Tannadice parish which Legacies herein before mentioned or that may be left in a writing signed by me I appoint to be paid at the first term of Whitsunday or Martinmas happening twelve months after my death with interest thereafter Reserving always to myself my own Liferent use and enjoyment of the whole premises with full power to me at any time in my Life and even on death bed To after innovate or revoke these presents in whole or in part, And to Assign and Dispose of the Estates and Effects hereby conveyed in any manner I may think proper But in so far as these presents shall not be altered or revoked the same shall be valid and effectual altho found lying in my own Custody or in the Custody of any other person undelivered at the time of my death with the not delivery whereof I hereby Dispense for ever And I Consent to the Registration hereof in the Books of Council and Session or other judges books competent therein to remain for preservation and that all action and execution pass hereon in form as affairs & for that purpose I Constitute

My Procurator &c In Witness Whereof these presents consisting of this page and the three preceding pages written by James Wyllie Writer in Forfar upon Stamped paper are subscribed by me at Glenquich House on the fourth day of July in the year one thousand eight hundred and twenty eight before these Witnesses the said James Wyllie and Archibald Macdonald servant to me at Glenquich House [signed] John MacLagan, Jas Wyllie witness Archibald Macdonald Witness (wrote at the foot of the said deed thus) I the said John MacLagan Esq do hereby Declare and specially condition That the said Daniel alias Donald Anderson and his heirs and the whole heirs of Provision before described and the husband of any heir female succeeding under the foresaid destination shall be Holden and obliged to assume and constantly to retain and bear the surname arms and designation of MacLagan of Glenquich and Memus as their own proper surnames arms and designation in all time after their succeeding to the said Estates In Witness Whereof this declaration & condition written by the said James Wyllie Writer in Forfar are subscribed by me at Glenquich House the twenty eighth day of August eighteen hundred and twenty eight years before these Witnesses the said James Wyllie and Archibald Macdonald servant at Glenquich House [signed] John MacLagan, Jas Wyllie Witness Archd Macdonald Witness Extracted upon this and the eight preceding pages by me Sheriff Clerk Depute of the County of Forfar [signed] Alex Henderson written by J.
