PCC Will of Leeds Mason of Enfield, London 1800

In the Name of God I Leeds Mason of Pondersend in the parish of Enfield in the County of Middlesex Gentleman do make this my last will and testament first I direct my Body to be ... & privately buried in such place & manner as an Executor shall think proper. I will & direct that all my just debts funeral expenses be fully paid & satisfied. I give & bequeath to **my dear friend & son in law William Baker Naylor** of Pondersend aforesaid all my Real freehold copyhold & leasehold & personal estates & effects whatsoever & wheresoever with all monies I have in the Bank of England or elsewhere with all rents & interests that may be out at my decease & I do nominate & appoint & constitute my said son in law William Baker Naylor sole Executor to this my last will revoking all ... wills by me made In witness whereof I have set my hand & seal this day of ___ in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred ninety two. Signed sealed & delivered by me Leeds Mason as & for my last will & testament in the presence of ...

19th March 1800 - Appeared Personally **Joseph Gough** of Gracechurch street in the parish of Saint Peter... London Stationer and **John North** of Gracechurch Street in the Parish of Allhallows London Turner and made oath that they knew and were well acquainted with Leeds Mason late of Ponders End in the Parish of Enfield in the County of Middlesex deceased and also with his manner and character of hand writing and subscription... frequently seen him write and subscribe his name that having now carefully viewed and ... the paper writing hereto annexed purporting to be and contain the last will and testament of the said Leeds Mason of Pondersend in the parish of Enfield in the County of Middlesex Gentleman and... witness whereof I have set my hand & seal this day of ___ in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred & ninety two and ... endorsed Signed sealed & delivered by me Leeds Mason as & for my last will and testament in the presence of... say... and in their consciences believe the whole Body... and contents of the said Will beginning ending and endorsed as aforesaid to be all of the proper handwriting of the said Leeds Mason deceased... also appeared personally William Baker Naylor of Ponders End aforesaid and **Susanna Naylor wife of the said William Baker Naylor** and made oath that the said Leeds Mason deceased did on the ... day of February last that on searching for his will on the first day of March instant they found the abovementioned last will and testament of the said deceased beginning ending and endorsed as aforesaid locked up in a bureau in the deceaseds Bed Room amongst other papers of Moment and ... said will was the only paper... of a Testamentary disposition and that the same is now in every respect in the same ... and condition as... found by them as aforesaid and the said **Susannah Naylor for herself make oath that she is the natural and lawful daughter only next of kin** and the only person entitled in distribution of the personal estate and effects of the said Leeds Mason deceased in... had died intestate Joseph Gough, John North, W. B. Naylor, T. Naylor... Same day the said Joseph Gough, John North, William Baker Naylor and Susannah Naylor wife of the said William Baker Naylor were duly sworn to the ... of this affidavit before me C. Coote... Henry Ibbetson, Notary Public.

This Will was proved at London the twenty second day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred before the worshipful Charles Coote Doctor of Laws and Surrogate of the Right Honourable Sir William Wynn Knight also Doctor of Laws Master Keeper of Commissary of the Prerogative Court of Canterbury lawfully constituted by the oath of William Baker Naylor the sole executor named in the said Will to whom administration was granted of all and singular the goods chattels and credits of the said deceased having been first

sworn duly to administer Susannah Naylor the wife of the said William Baker Naylor the natural lawful daughter only next of kin and the only person certified to the personal estate and effects of the said deceased in... died intestate first...
