The Advertiser (Adelaide) 30 Jun 1913 Sudden Death – Barrister stricken while playing golf

Sydney June 29. Mr Lewis Whitfield, a well-known barrister dropped dead on the Royal Sydney Golf Club's links at Rose Bay yesterday afternoon. He was playing a round with Mr Edward Gaden, when he collapsed. Dr George Bell, who was on the links, was called, but Mr Whitfield was dead. The deceased was a son of the late Mr Edward Whitfield, master of the Sydney Grammar School. He was called to the bar in 1888. Mr Whitfield appeared in court yesterday morning as counsel in the Watt divorce suit, and was then apparently quite well. Mr Whitfield and his opponent had reached the tenth green. Mr Whitfield was putted for the hole, jocularly remarking that he could bet on the success of the stroke, and he holed out the putt and fell. Mr Gaden thought he had merely fallen over, but a glance was sufficient to show him that the case was serious. A few yards distant Dr Bell was playing, and he ran to the spot, only to find that Mr Whitfield was past aid. The body was removed to the caretaker's cottage, and immediately all play, both on the links and on the tennis courts, ceased.
