

**New Zealand Company Accountant's Office Papers**

Identifiers are recorded in these papers in various ways and they probably relate to correspondence and other related records. These are included in the inventory below under the heading "ID's". The papers are loosely arranged within the 'box' where all the Ds are together etc. The transcript below is arranged firstly into an alphabetical order and secondly in date order as shown by the New Zealand Company 'stamp'. The latter records the date received.

[1] Letter – Taranaki 21 Jun 1843. The amount of the freight of goods brought to me by the 'Oriental' and which according to your desire I paid to the Company's Agent here, has, by error, been deducted from a claim made on my behalf at the New Zealand House, London for the value of the Bricks I paid you for at Plymouth and which Captain King thought proper to sell to the Captain of the 'Amelia Thompson'... As you have been the principal agent in this affair, I hope you will excuse my troubling you to make the necessary explanation to the Company's Secretary and to request him to send a Cheque for the amount (erroneously charged) to my agents Messrs Rickards, Leith & Co., 15 Bishopsgate Street, to be placed to my Credit. I have, not long since, twice troubled you on the subject of my sons coming out as Settlers to this Colony, and I anticipate from your kind offers of assistance to myself, on leaving England, the transfer of your good offices to them for which I shall feel doubly thankful. On their arrival, I mean to return to fetch the remainder of any family, provided the Settlement flourishes, which, if it... with the others the favour of the Directors then is not the least doubt of its doing. We have just heard by the 'Essex' of Capt. Liardet's arrival in England – his report of this beautiful and rich settlement which I am sure will be a favourable one, will 'eer this reaches you, be succeeded by others of the same unquestionable character, and in such I hope the emigration hither of capitalists, who are so much wanted. I remain, Dear Sir, your faithful servant, L. H. Davy.

P.S. I think it right to enclose to you Mr Wickstead's Certificate of my having received no drawback from the amount of my land purchase, which I am unquestionably entitled to by the Company's advertisement to the extent of 25 per cent.

[2] Letter dated 20 Jun 1841 – Woolcombe, Plymouth to Capt. Davey.

Dear Sir, I beg you herewith an account of freight due to the Company for goods on board the 'Oriental' the amount of which you will be pleased to pay to Capt. King or the principal agent of the Company, I remain, Dear Sir, Trusting, ... Woollcombe

[3] Letter dated 15 Nov 1841 Henry J. King, New Plymouth to the New Zealand Company

I, Henry King, late agent to the Plymouth Company of New Zealand, do hereby certify that in consequence of an arrangement entered into for the sale of the Company's bricks, embarked on the 'Amelia Thompson' with the Commander of that Ship, those purchased by Captain L. H. Davy, in number five thousand, have not been delivered to him according to the instructions received and that the said L. H. Davy is therefore entitled to the reimbursement of the purchase money.

Note: Sir, Please pay the above to William Dundee Esq., whose receipt will be a final discharge, I am, Sir, your obedient servant, L. H. Davy.

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**William W. DRAKE, Walthamstow**

Stamp Date: 06 Jul 1842 ID's: 3992, 327 Letter dated 05 Jul 1842. Sir, I paid for a young woman of the name of Jane Burnside about 17 or 18 years of age the passage money to New Zealand £18 5s by the ship 'Sir Charles Forbes' which was to sail the 10<sup>th</sup> May last. The Father and Mother have been dead several years and I have contributed principally to her support for some time. I placed her as an Apprentice to a Mr and Mrs Quinlan, Straw Hat manufacturers giving them a fee of £30. They are gone out by that ship and Jane Burnside having been very happy with them was desirous to accompany them to New Zealand and to equip her abundantly for that purpose my wife was at much trouble and we expended including the Passage money about £100. The Girl has behaved very ill having on the day appointed for her to go on board waylaid the packages containing her things & gone off whither or with whom I know not. Under these circumstances I think it right to ask of the New Zealand Company a Return of the Passage money which I hope they will grant in part at least if not wholly. I beg you to submit my request to the Directors of the Company to some of whom I am well known particularly to my Neighbour Mr Alderman Copeland – and requesting the favour of an answer to inform me of the Determination of the Directors.

Annotation 1: E.D. report whether Jane Burnside has embarked or not, or what has become of her.

Annotation 2: Allowed 11 Jul 1842 that £18 5s received on 21 Apr 1842 for the passage of Jane Burnside be returned, although she has not embarked.

Annotation 3 dated 06 Jul 1842: On the 21<sup>st</sup> of April Mr Drake paid £18 5s for a Steerage Passage for Jane Burnside, who was to have gone out under the care of George Quinlan and wife in the 'Sir Charles Forbes' and a berth was reserved for her in that ship until the day the Emigrants embarked, but she did not appear & Quinlan said she refused to go at all in consequence of Mr Drake's not providing her with what she considered sufficient money. I have heard nothing of her since that time. D. W. Dowling for Superintendent of Emigration.

Sir, I am much obliged for your promptness and attention. The first two lots in Nelson that I bought were for my friend Mr Valle of Hoddisdon and I paid the deposit of £60 on the 28<sup>th</sup> February last and the other lot in the same settlement that I purchased was for my friend Mr Philip Valle for which I paid the deposit on the 15<sup>th</sup> May following. The amount of these purchases was £900 consequently my demand upon the Company is £45.

Letter written by Bryan Edw. Duppa of 1 Lowndes Square to John Ward

My Dear Sir, Enclosed you will find a list of the Emigrants provided by me for the New Zealand Company together with the sum... paid to their Agents for obtaining a similar number a sum which, you may easily suppose, is perfectly inadequate as a remuneration for the trouble and expense to which I have been put, under peculiar and urgent circumstances in their selection. I think therefore if you make this upon recitation to the Directors they will not object to pay me £71, instead of £35 10s, which will about defray my expenses, Believe me, Truthfully yours, Bryan Edw. Duppa.

Letter: Bryan Ed. Duppa to John Ward

Sir, You will perceive by the enclosed document that I have sent by the ‘Katherine Stewart Forbes’ ten Adults for whom the Company do not allow Agency. As I have devoted much time and money in the selection, I think if the Company pay me two pounds per head for the remainder the balance will not be much in my favour.

Annotation: Mr Duppa is not entitled by the Regulations to any allowance for the ten single Emigrants enumerated in Account “**B**”, but as it appears he has been put to expenses and as he has done so much for the Company, I submit to the Fincance Committee to allow him £10 on Account “**B**” in addition to the usual allowances on Account “**A**”. Sir, With reference to Mr Duppa's account for the selection of Emigrants, I have to report as follows: The families named in the account, from James Bradley to George Oxley inclusive, were selected by Mr Duppa. Charles Barrow, a single man, was included in the application made by Mr Duppa for his father & family, but he did not embark with them, & was allowed; having made another application, to follow them in a subsequent Ship. Rebecca Burns & her family with Joseph Vant & his family were selected by Mr Baily of Lenham near Maidstone, whom at the time I understood was acting for Mr Duppa. The charge for conveying a couple from the Steamer to the Ship was for John Lingard & wife who were to have embarked in the 'Katherine Stewart Forbes' but came to London too late, and on arriving at Gravesend by the Steamer in which Mr Duppa was, he saw that the Ship had sailed and took them in a Boat as far as the Hope.

Note to Mr Harrington dated 11 Dec 1843: In June 1840 the sum of 30s was advanced to Emigrants selected by Mr Duppa, and it has always been stated by Mr Alston to have been advanced at the request of Mr Duppa, who now, has no recollection of having authorised the payment. As there is no possibility of getting it repaid had it not better be allowed.

With reference to Mr B. E. Duppa's account for commission on purchases of Nelson allotments, I beg to observe that, at the time the accountant and I went through the List of Applications, all those which were signed by the purchaser himself and not by a person as Agent, were marked by us "Without Agency". Mr Duppa now claims commission on the ground that these purchases were made through him:- With respect to Nos 1,2,3,4,7,8,9&10, I believe that the purchases were made mainly through the representations of Mr Duppa as Chairman of the Committee of Colonists. And in regard to the other two, I submit that no agency should be allowed on Lady Ailesbury's purchase (standing in the name of her Ladyship's trustee) – and I do not recollect the circumstance of Mr Arnold's purchase with sufficient clearness to enable me to offer an opinion, except that I think it was Mr Ward who induced him to purchase.

The prophesiers of ill, with respect to this enchanting and fertile country, have long since ceased to utter their forebodings, and New Zealand has progressed with rapid strides to what we now find it. There is a tone of truth in the following letter, which is more fully corroborated by the signature which was attached to it, that must cheer the most sceptical:- My Dear \_\_\_\_, Many thanks for your two letters of July and August. I must say that you are an uncommon croaker; you anticipate all sorts of difficulties in our settlement, and I recollect before we left England your foreboding no good to the expedition. Considering your own courage, this is surprising; but I think the tone of your last letter is better, and looks as if even you thought that we should succeed. My own opinion is, that no settlement ever went ahead so fast as this has done. In 15 months we have a population of 2000 English and 800 natives, all on the most friendly terms, not one serious quarrel having occurred during the time. One magistrate and 30 soldiers are our only government. A large town has sprung up. Every commodity, and most luxuries, are found here at reasonable prices, and the necessaries of life are cheaper here than in England. We have always 10 or 12 vessels lying in the harbour, and everybody seems to be making money. *Que voulez vous de plus?* Races ! – a theatre !! and a variety fair. You Indians must have carriages, and palanquins and bearers, and fly-flappers, and nurse bearers, but climate renders us able to do for ourselves. There has not occurred one death of an adult from natural causes since we landed; two or three infants, and a few persons drowned by accidents, have been the only things like casualties. Nothing, I assure you, can exceed the salubrity of the climate. The men can work more than in country that I ever saw, and your sex looks more blooming than in England. I hope before long my Emily will come out, whom I shall hope to have at the head of my house. I heard once from \_\_\_\_, who talked of coming out here. If you write to him, say how glad I shall be to see him, and that his fears as to 'roughing it' are groundless. We have several good hotels, and houses are to be hired, not quite so fine as at Brighton perhaps, but good enough even for an invalid. I hope some of your neighbours will try this climate, as it probably will be good for Indian constitutions. It seems to me to put life into the most shattered, and every body grows fat. I really feel ten years younger in health and spirits since I came here. This goes direct to Bombay by the 'Martha Ridgway'. It is our short way of sending to England. Our town is called Wellington.

Bill @ 7d/d or in an order on a Banker at this place, when in possession of this money we will send you a stamped receipt for the amount – enclosed is an account showing a balance of £39 3s 6d still due to us; if upon examination you find the same correct remit us the amount as required above. In this statement we have not included the 5s gratuity to emigrants, that amount having been disbursed by Mr Heyworth, in whose absence we can give you no further account of it, nor according to the arrangement made between you and him have we charged you with the expenses of printing (£5 12s) although to this latter amount we consider ourselves fully entitled, having incurred that expense solely on behalf of the Company; neither do we see that you can with any justice demur to the payment of it; if upon reconsideration you can pay us this sum, send us down the money along with the £39 3s 6d. Mr Starkey (of the firm of Bold & Starkey of this place) has frequently called upon us and expressed himself much disappointed at your having not given us any information for him respective a vessel called the 'John McVicar' concerning which ship he states that you and he have been in treaty and that Mr Somes promised that some definitive answer should be given to him without further delay, which to him is a matter of very serious consequence. Will you write to us on this subject by return of Post.

I should have made application to the Court for permission to dedicate the work to them, but I thought it would be more to their interest that it should come out perfectly independent and that there should not appear to be any connection between the author and the Company; more particularly at the present moment when there is a paragraph going through the papers calculated to prejudice emigration to that country. I beg the Court's attention to the circumflex in page 41. I have brought out one thousand copies, and have transmitted 300 copies to my friends who reside in Kent, the other 500 I am enabled to dispose of in Colrairie, Londonderry and among the respectable farmers of the neighbourhood some of whom have already intimated their intention of emigrating to New Zealand, for the appearance of my letters in the Public prints have caused a spirit of enquiry in this country, and several persons have already called upon me to examine a specimen of Flax which I brought home, and pronounce it superior to any grown in this country; a note upon this subject has been inadvertently left out but may be remedied in a future edition.
