Mr Tollemache expended £50. Moiety payable by the Company as per agreement with Mr Tollemache - £25 4s

Dear Sir, I beg respectfully to call the attention of the Directors to a promise made me on my leaving England in command of the *Will Watch* in their service of £5 per month during the time of her employment by the New Zealand Company being from April 1841 to December 1841 – eight months. [Annotation: Captain Walker entitled by recommendation of Land Committee 6 April confirmed 8 April & Captain Wakefield's report 18 Dec 1841 - £40.]

He will reprimand his men for the carelessness & take care there shall be no recurrence of it... 19 Sep 1843.
