The Mercury 23 Apr 1862 Marriage

April 3rd, at the residence of Mr W. Johnson, Brighton, by the Rev. George Clarke, Edward fourth son of William Rout Esq., of New Town, to Mary Ann, eldest daughter of Mr William Wills, Victoria.

The Mercury 19 Dec 1868 Death

On 18th December, at his residence, The Tower, New Town, William Rout, Esq., in his 79th year.

The Argus 3 Jun 1891 Death

On the 21st ult., at his residence, South Bridgewater, Tasmania, Frederick, youngest son of the late William Rout, of The Tower, New Town, Tasmania, in his 62nd year.

The Mercury 28 Nov 1905 Death and Obituary

At her late residence, Moonah, Sarah, relict of the late William Rout, Esq., aged 89 years. Funeral leaves above address this (Tuesday) afternoon 3 o'clock.

An old lady well-known in Southern Tasmania, Mrs William Rout, passed away yesterday at her late residence at Moonah. She was 89 years of age. As a young woman she left England as matron of the convict ship for females, Anson, and was afterwards employed by the Government as matron of an asylum for women. She was twice married, and leaves a son, Mr Beecher Rout. The deceased had been highly esteemed for her good work among the poor.

The Mercury 13 Oct 1920 Old Hobart
