Fishing at Rotorua - During the three months of the fishing season, which ended on Wednesday week 10,869 trout are recorded as having been caught in the lakes and streams around Rotorua. Large as the number may appear (says the New Zealand Herald), it does not indicate the real quantity of fish taken. The number recorded represents only about two-thirds the quantity caught, many anglers giving no account of the number and weight of the trout secured by them. Compared with the same period of last season, there is an increase in number of 2893, and in weight of 15,515lb. The fish recorded this season as having been taken a trifle over 4lb, while for the same period last season the average was barely three and a half pounds. From the 26th to the 31st ult., 665 fish were recorded as having been taken, the aggregate weight of which was 2597lb. Among the successful anglers were:- Messrs Brackebush and party, 80 fish, aggregating 320lb; Mr Corbett and party, 87, weighing 348lb; Messrs Sentsch and Rowland, 16, weighing 54lb; Mr Nathan and party, 14 fish, aggregating 56lb; Messrs Smith and Troup (two days), 31 fish, aggregate weight, 124lb; Mr and Miss Chirnside (two days), 30 fish, weighing 113lb; Messrs Seeley, Shepherd and Hoyes, 21 fish, of a total weight of 84lb. Mr and Mrs Guy, who have been angling for the past 19 days, report having taken from the Ohau Stream, fly fishing, 111 trout, the aggregate weight of which was 356lb.
