<i>Gravesend, Kent – Church and churchyard monumental inscriptions</i> Large square tomb; Inscribed on three sides, one being against wall:- West side: Mr Walter Medhurst died 13 th October 1791 aged 78 years. Also Thomas son of the above who departed this life the 19 th of February 1802 aged 50 years. East side: In memory of Phebe wife of William Troughton who departed this life... November 1808. Also the above William the second son of Thomas and Mildred Troughton born December 23 rd 1777 died April 10 th 1831. Also Thomas eldest son of Thomas and Mildred Troughton who departed this life 27 th November 1843 aged 67 years. South side: In memory of Charles Robins Troughton who died May 18 th 1836 aged 42 years.

This is the last will and testament of William Troughton of Milton and Gravesend in the county of Kent victualler. I give and bequeath to my wife all my plate linen household furniture stock in hand debts ready money and all property not hereafter mentioned for he own use and disposal upon condition of paying all my debts funeral and testamentary expenses and any codicil I should choose to annex likewise I give and bequeath to my wife during her life or widowhood the interest of my Bonds the profits of my Rent for office shares the Rents of my freehold estates upon condition of her keeping them in good and ...table repair likewise the profit of one half part of the ... and small tythes of the parish of ... the whole of which Mr Jonathan Hills and myself hold upon three lives upon condition of her keeping one half of the lives up during her life or widowhood and after her marriage or death I give and bequeath the said one half part of the Tithes unto my brother Thomas for his use and disposal also after my wife's marriage or death I give and bequeath the house in the Kew Road now in the occupation of William Chipperfield together with seven cottages in Barrak Row now in the occupation of William Penton and others for the use and disposal of my brother Samuel also after my wife's marriage or death I give the houses near the To... now in the occupation of Chapman ... Masterman and others for the use and disposal of my brother Medhurst also after my wife's marriage or death six Kent fire office shares together with my Bond of the Corporation for £400 my bonds of the Commissioners of Lamps and pavement for £200 and the other for £100 late ... for the use and disposal of my brother Joseph also after my wife's marriage or death eighteen shares in the Kent fire office for the use and disposal of my brother Charles and I hereby constitute and appoint my wife my brother Medhurst and my brother Joseph Executrix and Executors of this my will and testament in witness whereof I have set my hand and seal this sixteenth day of August one thousand eight hundred and twenty seven. W. Troughton signed sealed and published by the said William Troughton as his will and testament in the presence of us who in his presence at his request and in the presence of each other have subscribed our names as witnesses. Proved at London 26th October 1830 before the worshipful Jesse Addams Doctor of Laws and Surrogate by the oaths of Susanna Troughton widow the relict and Medhurst Troughton and Joseph Troughton Esquire the Brothers the Executors to whom administration was granted being first sworn duly to administer.
