Contents: The property was assigned, 11 May 1750, without equity of redemption, from John Caplen of Steyning, carpenter, and Edward Young of Steyning, fellmonger, his mortgagee, to Thomas Searle of Washington, farmer (no. WISTON/3309), who, by his will [blank] Jan. 1769, devised the property to his nephew, Robert Searle of Findon, husbandman (no. WISTON/3310), who assigned it, 2 June 1792, to Thomas Tidey of Washington, bricklayer (no. WISTON/3311). Following a mortgage (with bond), 14 June 1792, to James Goodjer of Steyning, glazier (nos. WISTON/3312, WISTON/3313), the said Thomas Tidey devised the property by his will, 11 Nov. 1793, to his wife, Elizabeth (no. WISTON/3314). There are Letters of Administration of the effects of the said Elizabeth, granted 5 Feb. 1820, to her son, William (no. WISTON/3315), who (of Worthing in Broadwater, blacksmith), together with the said James Goodjer, assigned the residue of the term, 30 Nov. 1821, to Josias Woolger of Steyning, grocer (no. WISTON/3316) and there is a solicitor's bill of costs and a note of the deaths of Thomas and Betty (Elizabeth) Tidey (nos. WISTON/3317, WISTON/3318). Richard Woolger of Steyning, shopkeeper (son of the said Josias Woolger) and others, assigned the property, 12 Oct. 1853, in consideration of £350, to the Rev. John Goring of Wiston (no. WISTON/3319).

Contents: The two earliest documents are copies of 'The Marks of Edburton Church Yard according to the Antient account as it was agreed and appointed by the Churchwardens and chief Parishioners. .. 15 May 1754', giving the amount of the church fence provided by each Landowner (nos. WISTON/4277, WISTON/4278). No. WISTON/4279 is a copy of the will, 29 March 1801, of Richard Keyse Salter of Stopham, yeo., who bequeathed an annuity, out of his property in the manor of Perching, to his wife, Hannah (no. WISTON/4279); his son, Richard Keyse Salter of Bignor, yeo., following a release of widow's bench from his mother and an estimate of timber and acreage, sold the property to Josias Woolger of Steyning, shopkeeper, who was admitted, 3 April 1824 (nos. WISTON/4280-4283). There is an abstract of Salter's title, reciting 5 July 1762-22 Nov. 1823 (no. WISTON/4284). Josias Woolger leased the property, 14 March 1825, to James Stevens of Fulking in Edburton, farmer (nos. WISTON/4285, WISTON/4286; with bill of costs) and there is another valuation of timber, c. 1829 (no. WISTON/4287). By his will, 25 Jan. 1841, the said Josias Woolger devised the property to his son, Richard Woolger (no. WISTON/4288) who was admitted, 26 Aug. 1844, and mortgaged the property the same day to Elizabeth Putland of Willingdon, widow (nos. WISTON/4289, WISTON/4290; with note as to admission costs). There is an agreement for the lease of the property, 24 June 1845, to Levi Lelliott of Woodmancote, yeo. (nos. WISTON/4291-4293; with copy and draft). No. WISTON/4294 is a warrant from Elizabeth Putland to vacate the conditional surrender made to her, and it is followed by a mortgage, 3 Dec. 1850, to Ann Burtenshaw of Cuckfield, spinster (no. WISTON/4295) which was vacated, 7 June 1852 (no. WISTON/4296). The Rev. John Goring of Wiston agreed to buy the property for £1,550 and following a deed of covenant, 9 June 1852, it was surrendered to his use the following day (nos. WISTON/4297, WISTON/4298), and he was admitted 14 Nov. 1859 (no. WISTON/4299).
