The Manor... after the Dissolution of the Monasteries... Henry VIII granted it to Sir Thomas Audley, Knt., who had been one of his most active agents in despoiling religious houses. He died in 1544, leaving issue two daughters, Mary, who died unmarried, and Margaret, who was married, first, to Lord Henry Dudley, younger son of John, Duke of Northumberland, and secondly, to Thomas Howard, Duke of Norfolk. From Thomas Howard, afterwards Earl of Suffolk, son of the Duke of Norfolk, the manor passed by purchase to Edward Newport, of Furneaux Pelham, and continued in the family of Newport until it was bought by John Calvert, of Albury Hall, Esq., whose son John Calvert, Esq., M.P., sold it, in the year 1806, to Mr Richard Wyman, of Hormead, yeoman. From his executors it was purchased by William Williamson Esq., on whose death in 1839, it came to his grandson, J. Williamson Leader, of Buntingford, Esq., the present Lord.

The Church... In the churchyard are many memorials of the family of Wyman, which has been settled in this, and the adjoining parishes, for a great length of time.
