Deptford St Paul, Lewisham Marriage Register 1815

Edward Oswald of this parish, bachelor and Ann Agutter of this parish, spinster and minor were married in this church by Licence with consent of parents this twenty second day of November in the Year One thousand eight hundred and fifteen by me T. F. Walker, Curate in the presence of Thomas Agutter, John Oswald, Thomas Oswald, Catharine Agutter, William Oswald, James Agutter and Sarah Hopkins.

This I declare to be my last Will and Testament – I bequeath to [my son George Agutter](#) [my daughter Sarah and Charlotte](#) my Leasehold premises situated in Mill Lane likewise the fixtures and utensils in Trade horses waggon and carts therein I likewise bequeath to the above named my household furniture plate.. I likewise bequeath to my son George Agutter one hundred and fifty pounds also to my daughter Sarah one hundred and fifty pounds also to my daughter Charlotte one hundred and fifty pounds I also bequeath to [my son James Agutter](#) my share in the freehold houses situated in Mill Lane I bequeath to [my oldest daughter Mrs Ann Oswald](#) fifty pounds and the residue of my property to be equally divided amongst [my children hereinafter named James, Thomas and George Agutter](#) and [my daughters Catherine Morrison, Eliza Watkins, Sarah Agutter and Charlotte Agutter](#) the sums named. I leave after my just and testimonial debts are paid... I leave my Sons James, Thomas and George Agutter and Thomas Dalby as my Executors, Deptford September 21st 1831. Signed Thomas Agutter. Witnesses George Shove, Broadway, Deptford, Henry Crossley, Church Street, Deptford and William Wills... Lane, Deptford.

Proved at London the 1st March 1832 before the Worshipful Jesse Addams Doctor of Laws and Surrogate by the Oaths of James Agutter and Thomas Agutter the Sons and Thomas Dalby three of the executors to whom admon was granted having been first sworn duly to administer, power reserved of making the like grant to George Agutter the Son also the other Executor.
