Frederick Bulliman, 35yrs, Farm labourer of Staverton, Northamptonshire, son of Thomas & Sarah. Father dead, mother living at Staverton. Can read and write. Religion: Church of England. No relatives in the colony. Paid £3 for self and family. State of bodily health: Good  
 Frances Bulliman, 33yrs, of Staverton, dau of Henry & Eleanor who are living at Staverton. Can read. Health good.  
 William Bulliman, 8yrs, of Staverton, son of Frederick & Frances. Cannot read or write. Health good.  
 Rebecca Bulliman, 5yrs, of Staverton, dau of Frederick & Frances. Cannot read or write. Health good.

*Sydney Morning Herald 17 Sep 1856 Advertisement*

Strayed into F. Bulliman's Paddock, alongside of the Illawarra Road, a Bay Mare, pony, no brand, switch tail, black points, bow knee near side; and also a mouse colour entire cob, branded FH on the near shoulder, and side white, star in the forehead, and scar down the face, two white hind feet. The owners can have them by paying all expenses.

*Sydney Morning Herald 24 Sep 1856 Advertisement*

Strayed into F. Bulliman's paddock, on the 16<sup>th</sup> September, in Hardell's Bush, in the parish of Petersham, alongside the Illawarra Road, a mouse-coloured entire Cob, branded F.H. on the near shoulder and side, white star in the forehead, scar down the face, two white hind feet. If not claimed in 14 days will be sold to pay expenses.
