Ann Nash daughter of Hugh & Ann Nash of Warnham died 04 Mar 1798 aged 19 years and was buried 07 Mar 1798

Hugh Nash of Warnham died 11 Feb 1803 aged 85 years and was buried 16 Feb 1803

Widdow Nash of Sullington died 03 Sep 1809 aged 67 years and was buried 06 Sep 1809

John Nash of Rudgwick died 12 Feb 1820 aged 73 years and was buried 16 Feb 1820

Sarah Nash widow of John Nash of Rudgwick died 20 Sep 1836 aged 85 years and was buried 25 Sep 1836

Rudge or Ridge (between Rudge Farm to north and Old Ockleys to south – now called Blacks Cottage (in Rudgwick). Copyhold – yearly rent 4s. Six closes, late parcel of lands called Rudge – the Broadsend 5s; the acre 1a 1r; the Oldoatirsh 6a 12r; the calfeield 4a; the Rowfield 6a.

1721 John Antill surrenders Rudge, in occupation of Ockenden Edwards, to use of John Edwards, his son (Arundel HC 121)  
1736 John Edwards (Rental Arundel HC 121)  
1762 Conditional surrender, John Edwards to Richard Bourne of Wisborough Green (WSRO Add MS 49.844)  
Pre 1789 John Edwards (Quitrent Arundel HC 120)  
1780 Richard Bourne admitted on forfeiture of John Edwards (WSRO Add MS 49.844)  
Post 1789 Richard Bourne [in occupation of John Nash] (Rental Arundel HC 120)  
1795 John Nash of Rudgwick yeoman admitted (Arundel HC 120)
