14 Aug 1840: Octavius Carrington certifies that the remaining part of Mr Carrington's House made by Mr Thompson has this day been shipped on board the *Slains Castle*

15 Aug 1840: Charles Booth has received per J. Jackson £30 12s being the balance due upon Mr F. Carrington's house.

04 Sep 1840: James Teague and Samuel Harris pay £5 for an outfit for clothing

07 Sep 1840: William Saunders - £3 for passage of Lakeman, four men & one woman

Oct 1840: George Wightwick, Architect – designs and detailed drawings with specifications &c for range of cottages and Store House; design on a reduced scale (with all required contract and working drawings...) for six cottages

16 Nov 1840: William Barrett – for building six cottages as per agreement
