29 Sep 1841 Copy of Power of Attorney – The New Zealand Company to Captain Francis Liardet passed under the common seal by Order of the Court in the presence of F. Dillon Bell, Secretary pro tem to the New Zealand Company and Thomas William Dukes, No.2 Henrietta Street, Covent Garden, London (Six A3 handwritten sheets)

5 Jun 1843 Mr Marshall to Richard Rundle – Coffin for the Native lad £1 5s settled by Richard Rundle

6 Jun 1843 New Plymouth – Received of J. T. Wicksteed Esq., £1 5s being for a coffin for a native lad, as per annexed bill – E. Marshall

7 Oct 1843 O. Carrington Esq. to J. Shaw – for making a coffin for a native - £1 1s – received J. T. Lacey ?

7 Nov 1843 Licence No.2 – John Tylston Wicksteed, Resident Agent of the New Zealand Company at New Plymouth owner of the Boat *Vesta* (dimensions given) having together with George Cooke and William Halse entered into Bond... and the *Vesta* is duly Licensed to be employed in discharging vessels in the Port of New Plymouth – signed James Webster, Sub Collector

Same date Licence No.3 – ditto above – Boat *Thetis* – together with John George Cooke and William Halse

Same date Licence No.4 – ditto above – Boat *Juno*

Same date Licence No.5 – ditto above – Boat *Ceres*

15 Jan 1844 By flour delivered to W. Fox at Nelson

12 Jun 1844 Indenture between Thomas Burd Hine and John Tylston Wicksteed – Schedule: 100 ewe sheep, five working bullocks, four cows, one bay cart mare, one brown card mare (in foal), 2,000lbs weight of American Tobacco in twelve casks, six packages of tea each containing four catty boxes, two chests of tea containing 168lbs.

12 Jun 1844 Memorandum Signed by Edward Dorset and witnessed by Thomas Standish – acknowledging receipt from John Tylston Wicksteed the stock and merchandise mentioned in the following schedule that is assigned to me for the purpose of sale.

Schedule: 100 ewe sheep £115, five working bullocks £75, four cows £48, two cart mares £80, 2000lbs with of tobacco in 12 casks £225, six packages of tea each containing four Catty Boxes £48, two chests of tea containing 168lbs £25.

21 Nov 1844 Robert Fitzroy, Governor to J. Jermyn Symonds Esq., Police Magistrate
I have to request that you will obtain the assistance of George Cutfield Esq., JP and Mr Frederick Thatcher, architect, and proceed with them to survey and value the boats, stores and building enumerated in the following list and now belonging to the New Zealand Company. You will afterwards have the goodness to state to me in writing, what you consider to be their present value and condition.

Large New Boat, Large 2nd Boat, Large 3rd Boat, Boats Gear, Anchors, Rope, Flagstaff flags & compass etc, Portable crane, Fixed crane, Six pounder guns, Musquet &c, Pistols, Swords, Ammunition.

Full detailed inventory enclosed received 29 Nov 1844 and a supplementary inventory for two sixpounders round and cannister shot; 22 Muskets, four rifles, one carbine, three pair of horse pistols, six Dragon swords, ammunition.

4 Aug 1847 Specification of work proposed to be done at the New Plymouth Corn Mill

4 Dec 1847 Letter to T. J. Macbean Esq., Post Office, Sydney, New South Wales

In the purchase lately effected by Mr Hulke of the New Plymouth Union Corn Mill is included a portion of Town Section No.623 which the present occupier Brooking & Pellew sold to the Mill in April 1846. On searching however at the Land Office I find the section is registered in your name. You will therefore excuse me for asking if you have disposed of the above section to Brooking & Pellew and if so why they have not the usual transfer in the New Zealand Company's books?

26 Jan 1848 John Smith to New Plymouth Union Corn Mill and Mr Hulke – Received of Mr Halse the following papers to be returned to him within a week from this date.

29 Jan 1848 Deed between: John Brooking of New Plymouth, carpenter **AND** John Smith of New Plymouth, storekeeper, William Black of New Plymouth, farmer and George Boardman of New Plymouth, sawyer the acting Directors of the New Plymouth Union Corn Mill.

31 Jan 1848 Draft Deed between: John Smith of New Plymouth, storekeeper, William Black of New Plymouth, farmer and George Boardman of New Plymouth, sawyer, acting Directors of the New Plymouth Union Corn Mill **AND** William King Hulke of New Plymouth, Gentleman

– seven A3 handwritten pages

Tracing – Plan of the Block of Land acquired by Mr Bell from Natives of the Puketapu Tribe March 1848 containing about 1500 acres (A3 + in size – coloured – and with names of signatories)

Jan 1849 – Requisition for Stationary for the Resident Agent's Office, New Plymouth – half a ream of ruled paper for accounts and half dozen _ plain ruled paper – signed W. Halse

There is also another undated requisition document – for paper, cards, pens, black ink, sealing wax (Enclosure in Despatch No.36/48)
